# Chandrayaan-3

As we wait for the soft-landing on the moon here's all you need to know about the mission.

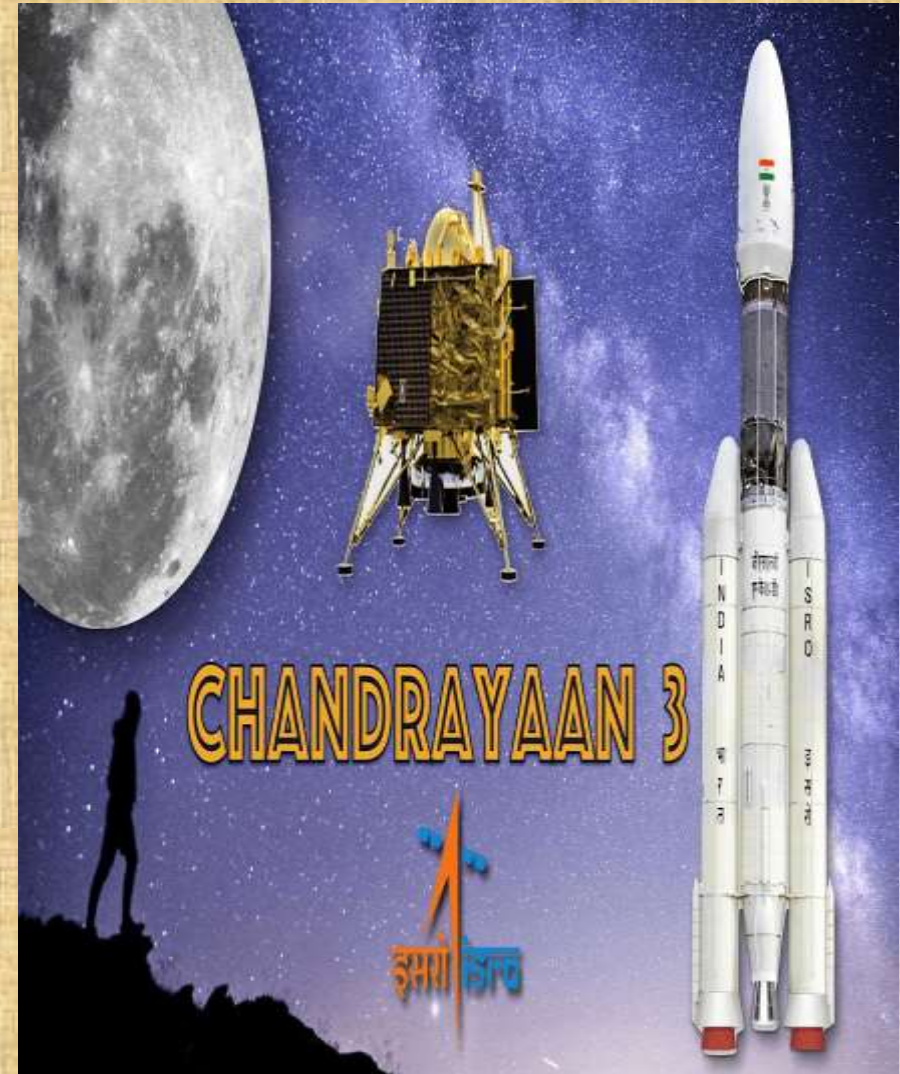
Chandrayaan-3 is India's third moon mission conducted by (ISRO) (Indian Space Research organization).

It was launched on July 14, 2023, from Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Srihari Kota, Andhra Pradesh.

The main purpose of Chandrayaan-3 is safe and soft landing on the surface of the moon.

Only 3 countries, U. S. A, Russia, and China have successfully soft landed on the moon.

India is the 4<sup>th</sup> country to have achieved a soft landing on the moon and the 1<sup>st</sup> to land on the lunar southern pole on August 23rd around 6:04 p.m.



The purpose was to achieve a successful landing on the moon's surface and deploy a Chandrayaan-3 rover to conduct experiments and gather valuable data. The mission is focused on studying the moon's geology, mineralogy, and exosphere which will contribute to our understanding of the moon's origin and evolution.

Chandrayaan-3 cost about ₹ 615 crores

The distance between the earth and the moon is 3.84 lakhs kilometres.

Chandrayaan-3 has been a remarkable achievement for India's space program. It consists of a lander module (L M), a propulsion module (P M), and a lunar lander called Vikram, and a lunar rover called Pragyan.

The rover is used to explore the lunar surface and collect scientific data.

Chandrayaan-3's success will further strengthen India's position in the global space community. This mission will inspire the younger generation to pursue careers in science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

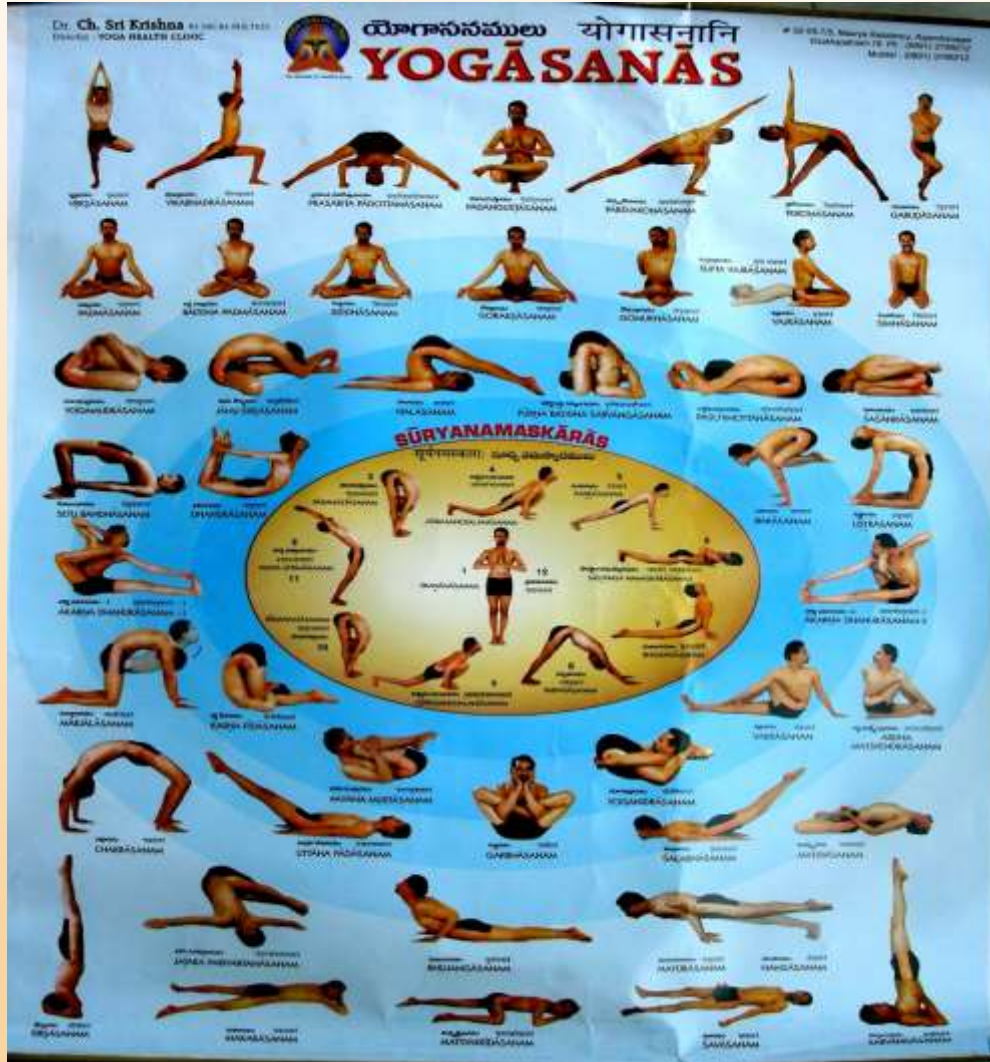
# YOGA

## Chandrayaan 3 – Moon Vehicle

We are proud of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO). On July 14<sup>th</sup> 2023, it successfully launched Chandrayaan 3 and it soft landed on the moon on 23rd August, making India the fourth country to soft land on the moon and the first country to land on the moon's South Pole. The main objective of Chandrayaan 3 was to do on site experiments on the moon's surface. It has 3 main parts the propulsion model, the Vikram lander and the Pragyan rover. Before Chandrayaan 3, ISRO had conducted two Moon missions which were Chandrayaan 1 and Chandrayaan 2. When Chandrayaan 1 found the possibility of water in the form of ice on the South Pole of the moon, ISRO launched Chandrayaan 2, but it failed. So, ISRO launched Chandrayaan 3 which was successful. The Pragyan rover had studied the moon for fourteen days. Chandrayaan 3 can also help in studying exoplanets from the moon and the possibility of life on other exoplanets.

Perhaps the greatest gifts we could give and receive this Christmas is hope, by sharing a little of what we have.

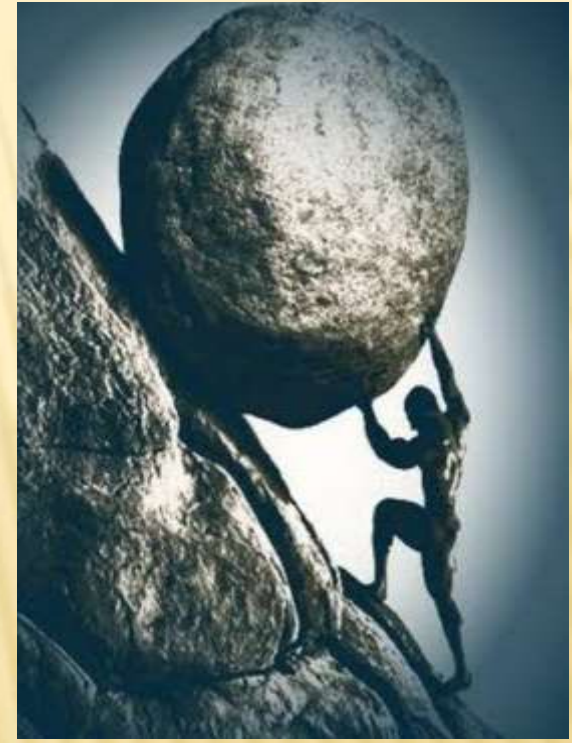


# సంకల్పం
